The fee for credit card payments, added to the transaction, is currently 2.75%.

PLEASE make checks payable to **VILLAGE OF RAYMOND** and enclose the appropriate stub from the bottom portion of the bill. **DO NOT** send CASH in the mail.

PLEASE include a **SELF-ADDRESSED STAMPED ENVELOPE** if not paying in person and you would like a receipt. **No paperwork will be mailed without a stamped self-addressed envelope.**

OVERPAYMENTS: NO refunds will be issued at the time of payment. Refunds will be sent in the mail by check after the payment has cleared the bank (approximately 10 days).

Pay in FULL by January 31, 2023 OR

Elect Installments: 1st Installment due Jan. 31, 2023;

2nd Installment due July 31, 2023 (payable to Racine County)

NOTE: The Village of Raymond cannot accept real estate tax payments after the January 31st grace period ends.

After that time, ALL real estate taxes must be made payable and sent to Racine County Treasurer, including late payments and the 2nd installment.

(For late or 2nd Installment payments, if paying online through ACI/Official Payments, enter "Racine County" as the entity and "Real Estate Taxes" for payment type.)

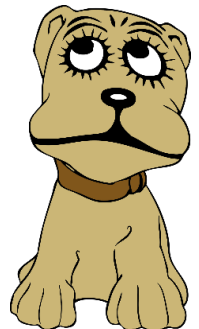

A Proof of Rabies Vaccine is **REQUIRED**. A Dog License will not be issued without updated vaccines. Please also include the completed form included with your property tax bill, with name, address and phone number of the dog owner. Racine County requires this information.

PLEASE make out a separate check for dog licenses. Do not include the license fee on your real estate tax payment check.

Be sure to include a stamped self-addressed envelope for the license, tag and paperwork.

Make checks payable to Village of Raymond. **A late fee of \$5.00 will be assessed after March 31, 2023**

WHEN IS A BUILDING PERMIT NECESSARY?

Below are the required permits for improvements you may be making to your home or business in the future. If any improvement is done without the required permit, you may be subject to a penalty and be required to remove the improvement. To obtain a permit, please contact the Village building inspector Lee Greivell at (262) 835-4819.

- All new Residential Dwellings or Commercial Buildings
- All additions and alterations (incl. roof replacement)
- Moving of buildings
- Swimming Pools
- Sheds, Garages, Pole Barns
- Decks
- Razing a structure
- Heating, air conditioning and fireplaces
- Plumbing & Electrical
- Any other permits as required by governing municipalities

Soil Disturbance Ordinance

Please remember to follow the Village of Raymond ordinance regulating soil disturbance. The ordinance can be viewed on the Village website. Any person conducting a land disturbing construction activity involving excavating, filling or a combination thereof is required to obtain a permit from the Village of Raymond. A permit application and packet can be picked up from the Village Clerk's office. Anyone in violation of this ordinance is subject to strict penalties and fines by the Village.

Garbage Pickup

The Village of Raymond does not have weekly home garbage collection. If you would like home garbage collection, please contact Waste Management at (262) 878-3818 or Veolia Environment Muskego location at (262) 679-0860 to find out about their contract services and prices.

If residents do not want to contract for garbage collection, they are allowed to take their waste to the Metro Landfill, which is located on Highway 45 and 8 Mile Road (the entrance is one block east of Highway 45 on 8-Mile Road). Their hours

are Monday, Wednesday and Friday, from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm, and on Saturdays from 7:00 am to 3:00 pm. If you have any questions, please call Metro Landfill at 1-414-529-6180.

*Residents arriving at the facility shall show proof of residency. Driver's License, utility bill or rental agreement are acceptable forms of residency.

*The maximum waste volume accepted shall not exceed 2 cubic yards per visit.

*Large loads from cleanouts or construction debris, boats, and hot tubs will not be accepted at the residential area and are subject to the standard gate rate.

*Appliances/white goods are not accepted at the residential area and must be recycled. This includes microwaves, refrigerators, washer and dryers, dehumidifiers, humidifiers and water heaters.

*Four automobile tires per year will be accepted per resident at the residential area. No large tires such as agricultural tires and semi tires will be allowed and are subject to gate rate.

*No plastic bags in the composting area. Bags must be emptied and put in the trash.

*The gate attendant reserves the right to reject any item self hauled by a resident or charge the resident the standard gate rate to accept the items.

Year in Review

Our call volume in 2022 remains steady compared to last year when we were breaking records every month. We are on track to respond to over 500 calls for service in 2022, which is a 20% increase from 2020. In the last 10 years we have seen an increase in our call volume by 34%. During this same time period we have seen a 37% decrease in membership.

We are the last Racine County community that provides both EMS and Fire response with an unstaffed fire station. This unique advantage has allowed our fire department budget to remain smaller than all other surrounding communities. Our dedicated members respond to the fire station when alerted for a call for service, and make a small hourly wage when performing Fire and EMS duties. Due to increased call volume, shrinking membership available during the day, increased response times, and little success with recruitment efforts, we have worked hard to provide the village board with options to address this challenge. We have submitted a plan to provide daytime staffing at the station similar to how all other municipalities in the county west of I-94 provide services. This change would transition the Raymond Fire & Rescue Department to a combination department with some paid staffing at the station daytime, and our same dedicated members providing coverage during evenings. The minimal paid daytime staffing would still require our current membership to respond to large calls that require additional resources, or multiple simultaneous calls. 63% of our calls occur 6:00am-6:00pm, when most of our members are at their full time jobs outside the village. We continue to recruit new members so please consider joining our team! The fire department has been planning strategically for this for the past few years, after our neighbors were all forced to make this change. The number of department vehicles has been reduced over the years and the capabilities of the first due fire apparatus have also improved significantly as our membership has dropped. We no longer have the large numbers we once did, and have become accustomed to doing more

with less. Additionally, we continue to have strong positive relationships with our neighboring fire departments and work closely together to keep our village residents, firefighters, and EMTs safe. The change to a combination department with some paid staffing would increase the fire and EMS resources available during the day, and reduce our response times. We strive to continue to provide the most professional, well-trained, compassionate service to the community that we can with the resources available to us.

The village board was unable to approve our staffing request due to budget constraints, and tax levy restrictions. The fire department and village leadership continue to plan for the most appropriate options. Please consider attending one of the multiple "Community Listening Sessions" where the fire department leadership will present data and answer questions. These "Community Listening Sessions" dates will be advertised and posted on the village website, and Facebook. Our leadership and village board wants input from you as they consider possible referendum or loan options to support some daytime fire and rescue staffing.

Earlier this year Raymond Fire & Rescue was awarded one federal and one state grant which will allow us to upgrade some of our aging equipment. In the past few years we have been awarded over \$325,000 to upgrade equipment that we would have had to budget for if we had not received these awards. These grant applications are very complex and time consuming, and are often unsuccessful.

On May 7th we put in service a new 2021 Pierce Enforcer fire engine that carries 2,500 gallons of water on board. Because there are no fire hydrants or municipal water supply in our village, all water must be brought in by truck when there is a fire. This engine will allow us greater flexibility when responding to a fire especially while responding with minimal staffing which is more common now due to our decreasing membership.

We continue to work with the village to map out a plan for our future including the necessities for station upgrades and apparatus replacement. We hope to utilize grant funding to assist with required village hall and fire station upgrades including the addition of much needed shower and locker room space. Our members lack the ability to shower after a call and must return to their home and family with an increased risk of exposure to contaminants.

Burning Hours

The Village of Raymond burning hours are from 12:00 pm (noon) to 7:00 pm, seven days a week. You are allowed to burn organic materials such as brush, grass, leaves, and small tree branches. You must attend the fire at all times and have one means of extinguishment. All burning, this includes agricultural burns, brush fires, and recreational bonfires, are to be called into the Racine County Communications Center at (262) 886-2300 AND the Raymond Fire and Rescue Department at (262) 835-1687. Please provide your name, the date, time, and address of the burn.



Smoke & Carbon Monoxide Detectors

Be sure to change the batteries on your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors semi-annually. A good rule of thumb is to change them when you change your clocks (daylight savings). Remember that detectors only last up to 10 years.

Wisconsin law states that all residential buildings have a working smoke and carbon monoxide detector on every floor.

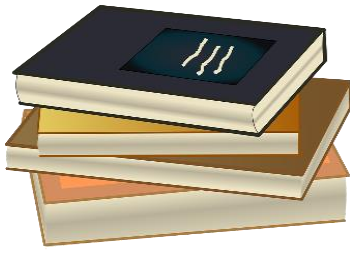
