BILLS PAID FROM December 28, 2022 – January 23, 2023: Village – \$3,836,301.87;SWUD - \$2,596.25, WERE APPROVED ON A GESZVAIN/KASTENSON MOTION. MOTION CARRIED 5-0.

MINUTES FROM PREVIOUS MEETINGS OF: December 27, 2022, WERE APPROVED ON A SCHWARTZ/GESZVAIN MOTION. MOTION CARRIED 5-0.

SHERIFF'S REPORT:

The Sheriff's report was given and the Board had no questions.

PUBLIC COMMENT – DOUG WHITE

He is concerned about the proposed Road Ranger coming into the Village. He also has concerns regarding wind farms and solar farms. If there is a problem on either, who is responsible? The land owner? The company?

President Morgan stated that the Board is not allowed to look at the contracts.

He would also like to see the Village Hall brought up to date. We need an easel so that when people give presentations, they are able to do so.

AMANDA FALASCI

Introduced herself – she is running for Raymond School Board. There will be a Primary on February 21st, and she would like support. She feels there is a need to lower the open enrollment numbers. She would also like to talk about referendum.

President Morgan urged people to attend school board meetings.

FIRE DEPARTMENT BUSINESS:

a. Discussion decision on EMS Billing Rates

Chief Smith stated that the last time the department raised rates, was in 2017.

A question was asked what percentage of rescue calls are residents?

Chief Smith said about 40% are non-residents.

President Morgan doesn't have a problem with raising the non-resident to be equal to what Union Grove charges, but, the resident charges should remain "as is".

MOTION TO RAISE NON-RESIDENT RATES TO MATCH UNION GROVE'S RATES, BUT, LEAVE RESIDENT RATES "AS IS", MADE ON A KASTENSON/GESZVAIN MOTION. MOTION CARRIED 5-0.

b. Discussion decision on using LifeQuest for fire billing.

Chief Smith states that LifeQuest keeps 11% of whatever the received back from billings. We are presently using them. The Department Clerk will still do the highway billing.

APPROVE USING LIFEQUEST FOR BILLING, MADE ON A GESZVAIN/SCHWARTZ MOTION. MOTION CARRIED 5-0.

SWUD BUSINESS:

Trustee Schwartz stated they are working on cleaning out North of 5 Mile to County Line.

PLAN COMMISSION BUSINESS:

a. Joseph Altenhoff (Arc Design Resources, Inc.), 5291 Zenith Parkway, Loves Park, IL 61111: Consideration of a request for a Concept Plan for a Road Ranger travel center on property located at 2058 27th Street (Property owner: 7 Mile Fair, Inc.). Tax Parcel No 168-04-21-13-001-000.

President Morgan said that the petitioners will be holding a neighborhood meeting. Trustee Kastenson talked about berming on the West side.

b. Bujar Kurti (Kurti Properites, LLC), 7576 S. Joshua Ct., Franklin, WI 53132: Consideration of a request for a Concept Plan for 7 Mile Road Flex Site on property located at W. 7 Mile Road (Property owner: Jeffrey and Kathleen Rozanske). Tax Parcel No 168-04-21-12-009-000.

This one had concerns about the traffic flow; there has been nothing engineered yet.

Trustee Thelen suggested holding off on any sort of occupancy until it is actually ready to be built on.

Mr. Sumwalt said that the when this comes before the Board, it could be for phasing.

Trustee Thelen asked what it is zoned right now?

Mr. Sumwalt said that it is presently A2 – there would need to be rezoning and a Land Use Plan Amendment.
